Real-time screen sharing allows team members to work together on tasks, presentations, or designs without delays.



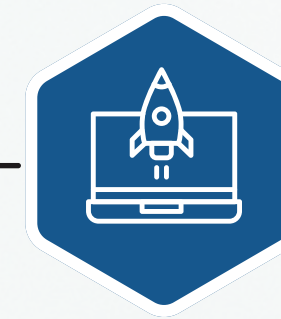
