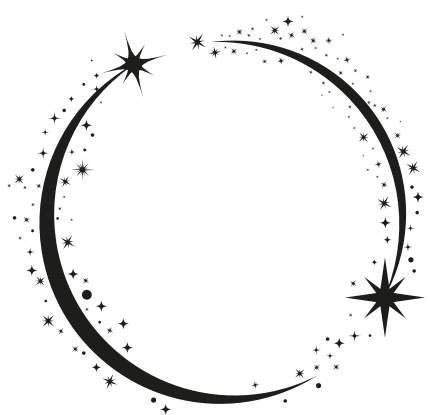
Temples are beautifully decorated, and special prayers are offered to Goddess Durga. Devotees visit temples to seek blessings and participate in community celebrations.
