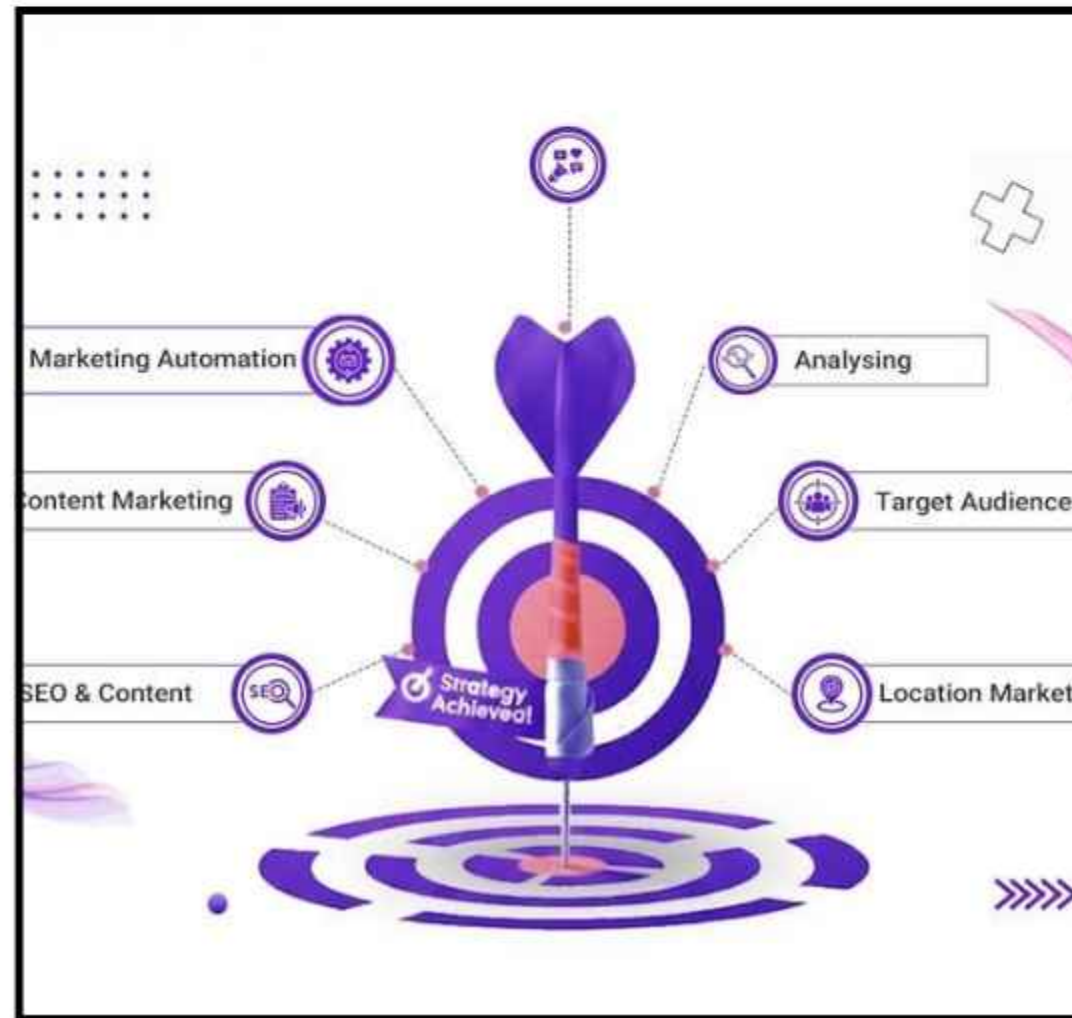
AD CREATIVES
