The Symbol of New Beginnings

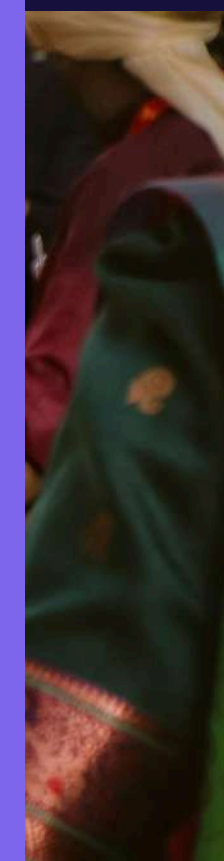
