

# How Does the 2- 2-3 Schedule Support Flexible Work Arrangements?



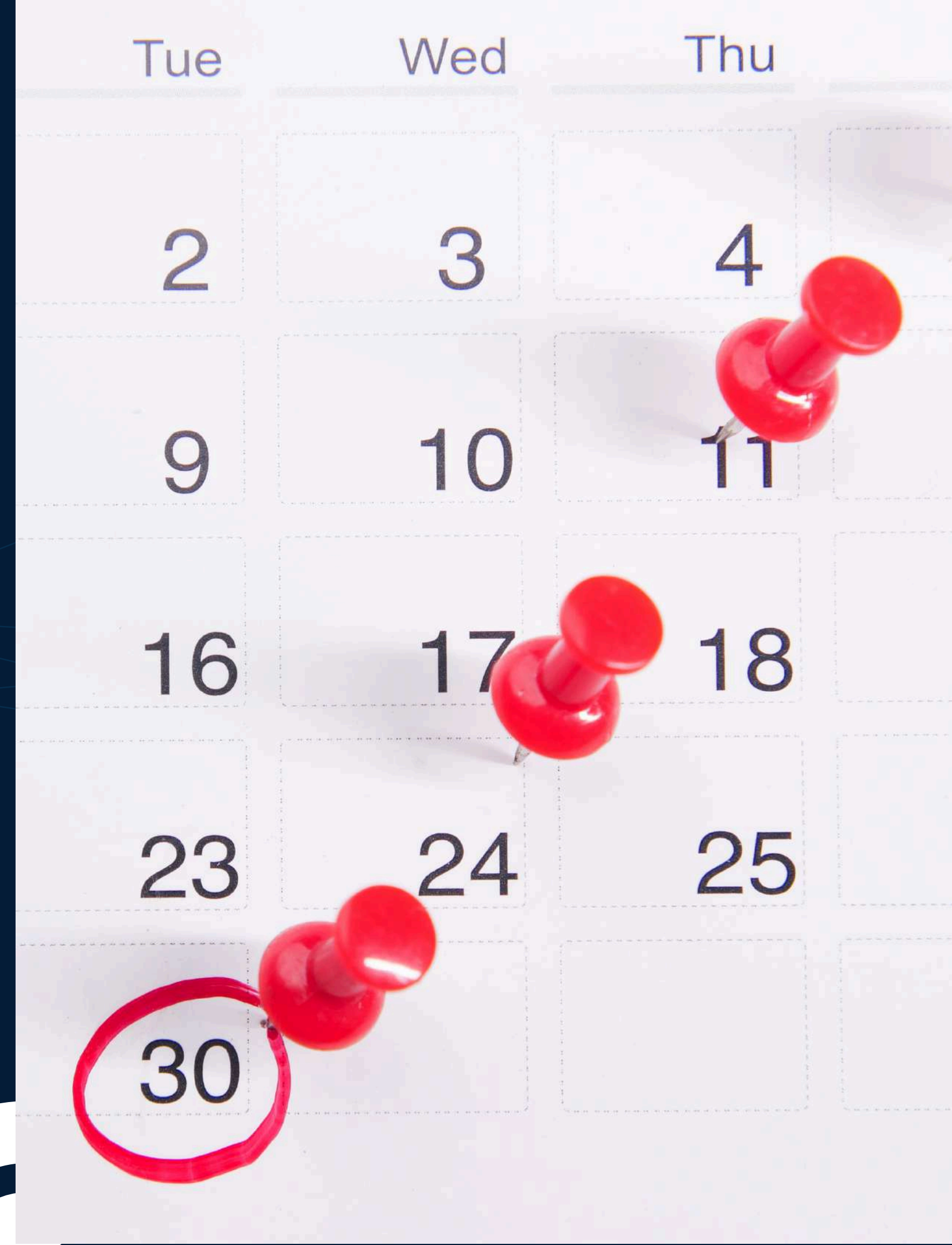
# What Is the 2-2-3 Schedule?

This structure ensures employees work every other weekend while still maintaining a consistent and predictable rotation.



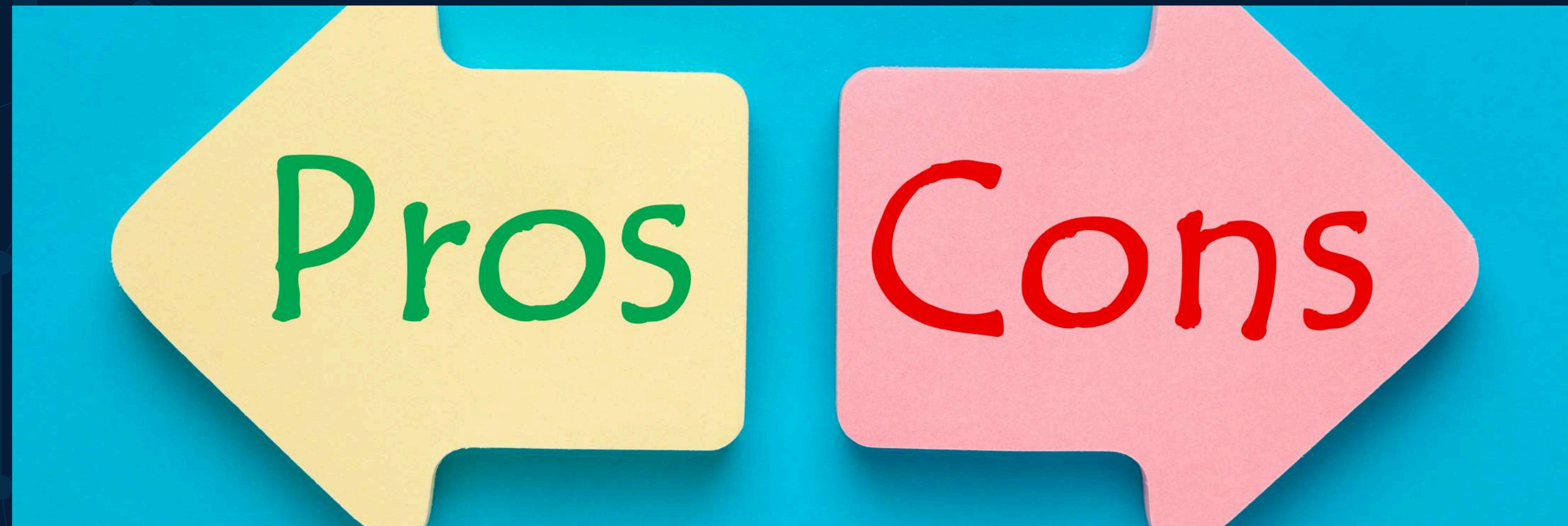


# Techniques to Implement the 2-2-3 Schedule Successfully
