

The Evolution of Custom Writing Services: A Critical Examination of Quality, Authenticity, and Student Experience

Recommendations

2. Custom writing services should be clearly labeled as such, and students should be warned about the potential risks associated with using these services.
3. Instructors should take a more nuanced approach to grading and feedback, recognizing that students may have used custom writing services and providing guidance on how to improve their writing skills.
4. Researchers should continue to study the impact of custom writing services on student learning and academic integrity, with a focus on developing evidence-based solutions to this complex issue.
